First, once again, I remind you of **Wolfgang's Vault** (below), the great store of 1960s rock from Bill Graham, with great merchandise as well. It used to be for free, but now charges a small annual fee—well worth it, in my experience.

In addition, **No Depression** is a great roots/rock service, which ranges broadly with interviews, news, and, of course, clippings from the day: <http://www.nodepression.com/> (thanks to Brian Pusser for putting me onto this).

Each week, the NY Times features a sampling from **Val's List**, a clever forum that regularly feature covers and makeovers of earlier songs, imaginatively remade by admirers: <http://valslist.com> .
